Last Friday, the Young Enterprise 'Learn to Earn' programme delivered in school was an ideal opportunity for all our Year 7 students to engage in activities to help them understand how education is key to their future success and happiness. They explored themes including career choices, personal skills, job interviews, financial planning and budgeting.

The trip to the University of Birmingham on Tuesday was a Year 8 aspirational visit. Gartree students enjoyed touring the University with a student ambassador and visiting the Law department. Having world class universities on our doorstep is an important resource to use to inspire students to study further.

Thursday was a particularly busy day with 45 Year 7 and Year 8 Gartree scientists visiting the Big Bang UK Science Fair at Birmingham NEC. This event gives young people the chance to hear from inspiring engineers and scientists from some of the UK's biggest companies, to find out about the opportunities available in science and engineering. Perhaps we can help to fill the UK STEM skills shortage from Gartree in years to come!

In school, Sport relief is all about getting students to feel good while they do some good. This year the theme is 'Whatever moves you'. Throughout the week there will be a range of challenges and activities taking place at lunchtime.

Sport relief funds are used to tackle critical issues affecting people across the UK and the world. Since the last Sports Relief, the money raised has:
